

January 2025 Section Luncheon



ASCE STL is proud to partner with EWRI St. Louis Chapter to host **Chad Olney** and **Gary T. Moore** at our upcoming January Section Luncheon! They will present on the Greenwood Cemetery Road Improvement Community Engineering Corps Project.

The Greenwood Cemetery Road Improvement Project in St. Louis, led by the St. Louis Professional Chapter of Engineers Without Borders, was recently completed. Over two years of effort resulted in \$350,000 in construction improvements and \$90,000 in pro-bono planning and design services for the

Greenwood Cemetery Preservation Association (GCPA). This historic African American cemetery, representing 150 years of St. Louis history, has been revitalized by GCPA since 2016.

The project offers valuable lessons in planning, project management, design, and construction, overcoming challenges like funding and complex design criteria. Community Engineering Corps, a collaboration of ASCE, AWWA, and EWB, brings engineering expertise to underserved communities, fostering impactful, community-driven solutions.

ASCE STL & ASCE Kansas City Sections are seeking volunteers to develop the **2026 Report Card for Missouri's Infrastructure**! The ASCE Infrastructure Report Card assigns a "letter grade" to each sub-category of infrastructure in our state. The Report Card is an important tool for public outreach and government advocacy. This document is frequently referenced in press

releases and utilized by our legislators in Jefferson City during public infrastructure budget discussions.

Our team is looking for:

 Section Writers – You will team up with another volunteer to write a 3-4 page write-up on the condition, funding sources, and reliability of a category of infrastructure. As this is a year long commitment, ASCE offers 7 PDHs for section writers! Our last Report Card included 11 categories:
