These prestigious awards are a fantastic opportunity to highlight the impactful work being done by our members and firms. Qualified nominations may also be considered for the ASCE Region 7 Awards.



Project of the Year Award

This award annually awarded to civil engineering projects within the St. Louis Section, recognizing owner, lead design engineer, and general contractor achievements. Eligible projects completed within 5 years prior to nomination submission, showcasing exceptional engineering skills and contributions to civil engineering progress.



Professional Recognition Award

This award recognizes the importance of professional attainment in the advancement of the science and profession of engineering and is presented annually to a Member of the St. Louis Section who has made substantial contributions to the engineering profession and the Section.



Young Engineer Award

This award recognizes professional contributions of younger members to the Society and to the Section and is presented annually to a Member of the Section who is less than 35 years of age.



Outstanding Faculty/Practitioner Award

This award is made annually for any Faculty/Practitioner Advisor who supports student chapters and civil engineering students. The nominee must be active with ASCE student members in the St. Louis Section and a member of ASCE.

Service to the People Award

The awardees need not be civil engineers but are selected based on their service to the general public that has some connection with the planning, design, or construction services in the civil engineering profession.

With over three decades of experience in transportation and civil engineering, she has established a remarkable career, including her work with the Illinois Department of Transportation and her leadership roles within several engineering consulting firms. Notably, Marsia founded Kaskaskia Engineering Group, which she sold in 2012, and Sequoia Engineering & Environmental, which was acquired in 2016 by Gonzalez Companies.

Her academic credentials include a BSCE'92 from South Dakota State University, a MSCE'96 and an honorary Doctorate of CE'24 from Missouri University of Science and Technology (Missouri

S&T). Marsia's professional engagement extends to her role as the 2024 Society President for the

American Society of Civil Engineers. Her contributions to the field have been recognized with numerous accolades, including ASCE's Edmund Friedman Professional Recognition Award of 2016 and the St. Louis Most Influential Woman Award of 2010. She has also provided testimony before the U.S. House of Representatives on infrastructure policy in 2018.

The St. Louis Chapters of the Geo-Institute (GI) and Structural Engineers Institute (SEI) are now accepting abstracts for the 14th Annual Structural and Geo-Confluence. The conference will be a multi-track, full-day event featuring technical topics and case histories presented by local and national experts. The joint morning session will focus on topics concerning the confluence of geotechnical and structural engineering. There will be two tracks in the afternoon: one track on geotechnical engineering and geo-environmental topics, and one track on structural engineering topics. The conference is open to all engineering and construction professionals and students. Last year's conference was attended by nearly 200 people from throughout Illinois and Missouri.

The planning committee is seeking speakers to provide a 35- to 50-minute presentation focused on structural engineering, geotechnical engineering, or geo-environmental topics with specific preference given to topics that overlap these focus areas. All persons are encouraged to **submit an abstract to Patrick Kinsella at pat.kinsella@shanwil.com by July 24, 2025**. Abstracts should be limited to 250 words. Once the planning committee has reviewed the abstracts, notification will be provided to the selected presenters by mid-August 2025. The submitted abstracts and presentation slides will be assembled and included in the conference publication.
