May 2024 Section Luncheon

ASCE St. Louis Section is proud to partner with our Younger Members Group (YMG) to host **Travis Helmkamp** at our upcoming May luncheon, presenting on the City of St. Louis's ADA Transition Plan.

The City of St. Louis faced the daunting task of developing an ADA Transition Plan, encompassing over 1,600 miles of sidewalks and 160 city buildings maintained by the Board of Public Service. Recognizing the long-term commitment required to eliminate access barriers, the City engaged in a thorough community engagement strategy. This approach sought feedback from residents and visitors to guide prioritization, considering the City's diverse population and the inherent limitations of community engagement.

Through this process, a prioritization system was established, leading to the identification of seed projects aimed at kickstarting a more accessible future. This comprehensive approach not only valued community input but also navigated the challenges of balancing feedback with practical considerations, resulting in a plan that represents the entirety of the City's needs and aspirations.

Travis Helmkamp, P.E., ACTCP, is a Project Manager at Oates Associates with a built expertise in ADA compliance. He has been involved in ADA Transition Plan development since 2010 and has managed all plans since 2017. In addition to his work with ADA Transition Plans, he also manages the development of pedestrian improvements plans. This gives him a unique understanding of not only developing the plans but understanding the challenges of implementing the plan. Travis received his BSCE from Valparaiso University. In 2015, he completed the ADA Coordinator Training Certification Program (ACTCP) offered by the Great Plains ADA

Center at the University of Missouri–Columbia. He currently serves as the Advocacy and Outreach Chair for the St. Louis Branch of APWA.



Nominate for ASCE STL Annual Awards

Project of the Year Award



This award annually awarded to civil engineering projects within the St. Louis Section, recognizing owner, lead design engineer, and general contractor achievements. Eligible projects completed within 5 years prior to nomination submission, showcasing exceptional engineering skills and contributions to civil engineering progress.

Professional Recognition Award



This award recognizes the importance of professional attainment in the advancement of the science and profession of engineering and is presented annually to a Member of the St. Louis Section who has made substantial contributions to the engineering profession and the Section.

Young Engineer Award



This award recognizes professional contributions of younger members to the Society and to the Section and is presented annually to a Member of the Section who is less than 35 years of age.

Outstanding Faculty/Practitioner Award



This award is made annually for any Faculty/Practitioner Advisor who supports student chapters and civil engineering students. The nominee must be active with ASCE student members in the St. Louis Section and a member of ASCE.

Harnessing Hydraulics: CHAMP's Response to the Gibson City Flood and Beyond

The Illinois State Water Survey's (ISWS) Coordinated Hazard Assessment and Mapping Program (CHAMP) prepares flood risk map products across Illinois, identifies high-risk areas, and engages community partners to act in preventing losses from flood hazards. In August 2021, Gibson City, IL, experienced unprecedented flooding, highlighting the critical need for accurate flood risk assessment and effective community engagement in flood mitigation. This presentation delves into the rapid response and innovative methodologies CHAMP employed during the Gibson City flood.

Hydraulic and Hydrologic Engineer, Illinois State Water Survey

Mr. Paudel joined ISWS-CHAMP in June 2021 and has since been working on various county-wide hydrologic and hydraulic studies for federal floodplain mapping efforts with the State of Illinois. He holds a B.E. in civil engineering from Tribhuvan University, Nepal, and MSCE in Water Resources from Southern Illinois University Edwardsville. His primary

research interests include riverine hydrology and hydraulics and watershed management. In his free time, he enjoys traveling, hiking, and playing soccer.

Join Geo-Institute St. Louis Chapter for our upcoming G-I STL Seminar A Decade of Seismic Resistance Advances: The New Madrid Seismic Zone by Greg Hempen, Ph.D., P.E., RG.

The 200th Anniversary of the Great New Madrid Earthquake Series was just over a decade ago. Within the decade since the Anniversary there have been a variety of important advances in the understanding of US earthquakes, assessing the risk from varied seismic zones, and furnishing products for assessment of, design for, and mitigation of earthquakes. The New Madrid Seismic Zone (NMSZ) remains the most active US seismic zone east of the Rocky Mountains. New large structures

and the rehab of certain structures are required to meet the adopted code, which are periodically revised, for life safety of occupants during an earthquake. New tools to meet the local codes for seismic resistance certainly make both more typical standard designs more comprehensive and understandable, and the structures more robust in resisting earthquake vibrations.


