Signing off as President and looking forward to another wonderful year! Peace,



We'll hear from project members from Metropolitan St. Louis Sewer District, Kokosing, Black & Veatch, and Crawford, Murphy & Tilly (CMT), on updating the biosolids facilities at the Bissell Point and Lemay Wastewater Treatment Facilities.





MSDPC is investing \$900 million to improve air quality in the St. Louis region by replacing century-old technology with innovative, environmentally friendly systems. Although the existing facilities continue to meet or exceed all air quality standards, the new systems will significantly improve air quality, reducing emissions by more than 70 percent. Construction of the new facilities are ongoing. Completion is anticipated in Spring 2029.

TOPIC: How do We Know We are More Sustainable? Methods and Tools for Evaluating the Sustainability of Engineering Projects





Dr. Jianpeng Zhou is Professor of Environmental Engineering in the Civil Engineering Department at Southern Illinois University Edwardsville, IL. He has taught water and wastewater, environmental and sustainable engineering, engineering hydrology and fluid mechanics; directed research in wastewater treatment and biosolids management, green infrastructures for stormwater management, and life cycle assessment. His work had been funded by federal, state, regional, local government agencies, and industries. Dr. Zhou was a Fulbright US Scholar to Brazil in 2017 and is a EWRI Fellow. Dr. Zhou received his Ph.D. and M.A.Sc. degrees from the University of British Columbia, Canada, M.Eng. and B.Eng. degrees from Tsinghua University, China, all in Environmental Engineering



Mr. Michael Buechter is a Program Manager at the Metropolitan St. Louis Sewer District (MSD) where he manages a team responsible for the preparation of construction documents for small to mid-sized projects, administration of several consulting engineering contracts, and administration of MSD's Small Contractor Program. Mr. Buechter served in many leadership roles with a range of professional organizations, including as a former President of ASCE St. Louis Section, a former Chair of ASCE's EWRI St. Louis Chapter, and a former member of the EWRI's (national) Governing Board. Mr. Buechter is a EWRI Fellow, earned his M.S. in Civil Engineering's Water Resources from Oklahoma State University, and B.S. in Civil Engineering from Missouri University of Science and Technology.

The St. Louis Chapters of the Geo-Institute (GI) and Structural Engineers Institute (SEI) are now accepting abstracts for the 14th Annual Structural and Geo-Confluence. The conference will be a multi-track, full-day event featuring technical topics and case histories presented by local and national experts. The joint morning session will focus on topics concerning the confluence of geotechnical and structural engineering. There will be two tracks in the afternoon: one track on geotechnical engineering and geo-environmental topics, and one track on structural engineering topics. The conference is open to all engineering and construction professionals and students. Last year's conference was attended by nearly 200 people from throughout Illinois and Missouri.

The planning committee is seeking speakers to provide a 35- to 50-minute presentation focused on structural engineering, geotechnical engineering, or geo-environmental topics with specific preference given to topics that overlap these focus areas. All persons are encouraged to **submit an abstract to Patrick Kinsella at pat.kinsella@shanwil.com by July 24, 2025**. Abstracts should be limited to 250 words. Once the planning committee has reviewed the abstracts, notification will be provided to the selected presenters by mid-August 2025. The submitted abstracts and presentation slides will be assembled and included in the conference publication.



ASCE St. Louis Section SAVE Coalition Members Respond to St. Louis EF-3 Tornado Largest-Ever SAVE Deployment But More Volunteers Needed

















ST. LOUIS, MO – On the afternoon of May 16th, the Missouri State Emergency Management Agency's Structural Assessment and Visual Evaluation (SAVE) Coalition, an ASCE St. Louis Section sponsored group of over 1,000 volunteer architects, engineers and building officials that are trained to quickly evaluate damaged buildings after a disaster, was holding a training class near I-64 and Big Bend. Less than two miles away an EF-3 tornado was cutting a path across the north side of St. Louis, from the city limits near Forest Park northeasterly to Interstate 70.


The tornado impacted thousands of buildings, prompting the City of St. Louis to ask the SAVE Coalition for the largest deployment in the group's history. For 8 days, spread over two separate 4-day deployments, over 100 SAVE volunteers worked with City Building Division staff to perform rapid structural safety evaluations on over 6,700 buildings. SAVE placed a red (unsafe), yellow (restricted use) or green (safe) placard on the evaluated buildings. The city requested more SAVE volunteers than were able to deploy. More SAVE volunteers and support for SAVE deployments is needed.

Each deployment day started with refresher training, swearing in as deputy building officials, and geographic area assignments for the 2-person teams. Results were reported in real time using an ESRI Survey123 smart phone app. Support for SAVE from the community across the damage area was very good.

SAVE's volunteer leaders, many having participated with St. Louis Building Division staff in the 2024 National Guard exercise at Busch Stadium, planned the day's activities, monitored the results using the real-time dashboard shown below, supported the field teams, and responded to city staff questions.

SAVE needs your help - the SAVE Coalition provides a free 7 PDH class to engineers interested in joining. SAVE is especially interested in recruiting newly licensed civil, structural, and geotechnical engineers with building design and/or construction experience. SAVE is a low time commitment organization and volunteers are never under any obligation to deploy. The next SAVE training class in St. Louis will be November 7, 2025.
